# Home Owners Fall Check List

# ✓ Disconnect garden hoses.

- Water that backs up during the winter can freeze inside the house, cracking pipes.
- Drain hoses and store them in a protected shed or garage.

#### ✓ Turn off valves to exterior faucets.

- If your home is equipped with separate shut-off valves for exterior hose bibs and sprinkler lines, ensure these are shut off prior to winter weather.
- Drain exterior faucets that cannot be shut off and cover with insulted covers.

## ✓ Seal cracks around windows and doors.

- Caulking can dry and crack, leaving gaps that allow winter weather to enter the homes wall cavity or even to the interior.
  - Apply new exterior grade caulking to gaps around doors, windows, utility penetrations as well as siding and trim joints.

# ✓ Trim back trees and shrubs.

- Winter weather can cause tree and shrub branches to contact home and damage structure.
  - Recommend trimming tree branches to maintain at least 5' from home.
  - All other vegetation should be kept at least 12" from home all year round to reduce moisture and pest intrusions.

#### ✓ Clean Roof and Gutters.

- Ensure roof surfaces are clear of leaves and other debris so that the roof can properly shed the wet winter weather.
- Keep gutters clean and properly sloped to prevent overflow that can cause serious water damage to the home.
- Recommend discharging gutter run-off 4'-6' downhill and away from home to maintain foundation integrity.

# ✓ Heating and conditioning system check.

- Now is the time to give your heating and ventilation system a complete physical.
  - Recommend having a certified HVAC technician perform a maintenance check every year before winter.

## ✓ Replace batteries in Smoke and CO Detectors.

- Its is recommended by the US Fire Marshall to replace batteries and test your detectors annually.
- o Exception is the sealed lithium "10 Year" Units. (Still need tested annually)
  - These where introduced in 1995 and may need to be replaced now.
    - Recommend placing date on these units when replaced and logging that information at your electrical panel.

# ✓ Test GFCI Receptacles.

- This is also a great time to test all of your <u>GFCI/AFCI receptacles</u>.
  - Wet weather and unsafe electrical is a dangerous combination.
- Make sure each receptacle or breaker properly trips and then resets.
  - Immediately replace any that fail.

## ✓ Check your fireplace and chimney.

- o Make sure the damper opens and closes properly.
- o Check chimney flue for debris and bird nests.
- Check the firebox for and loose or cracked bricks.
- A Chimney sweep can help with any of these tasks as well as cleaning the flue.



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
